Open AAA Repair Checklist

You will spend the first night in the ICU.
The average stay in the hospital is about 7 days.
Sometimes you will find that your bowel is a bit lazy in the first few days after the procedure. You will receive some medication to normalise your motions.
Stitches are usually removed after 14 days by your GP.
The post-operative compression dressing will be changed to compression stockings after surgical review the morning after your operation.
If you are on diabetic medications that contain dapagliflozin or empagliflozin (Forxiga, Qtern, Xigduo XR, Jardiance, Jardiamet or Glyxambi) these may be withheld for up to 4 days after the procedure.
Mobilisation in form of light exercise is encouraged post-operatively.
However, do avoid strenuous exercise for 6 weeks.
Do not lift anything heavy for 3 months.
Do not drive until you are fully mobile again and can comfortably perform an emergency break.
Open aortic repair is a big surgery. There will be ups and downs during your recovery. It can take up to 6 months to feel fully back to normal.
Please take your prescribed pain medication over the full duration to ensure that you stay comfortable and that the wound settles nicely.
Your post-operative follow-up will be 6 weeks after the procedure. However, should you be concerned about anything, please let us know and Dr Ritter will see you earlier.
